2019 Volleyball Camp Rules

1. Campers must always have a buddy.
2. Campers must be in their rooms by 9:45 PM and lights out by 11:00 PM
3. Lock your room at ALL times. Neither Central Florida Volleyball Camp nor UCF Housing will be responsible for lost or stolen items.
4. Any problems in the Dorms should be reported immediately to UCF Staff.
5. Do not enter anyone else's room without their permission.
6. Stay only on the floor designated for the volleyball camp. Anyone found on the floor other than that designated for volleyball will be sent home.
7. You are responsible for any damage to your room, the Dorm, the Gym, or other UCF Buildings.
8. You are responsible for your room key and meal card. If lost, the replacement fee is \$20 for the meal card, and \$50 to replace the lock and key.
9. Please do not run, scream, or slam doors in the Dorm. Treat the facility like you are at home. Be respectful of the other people in your suite and remember why you all came to camp.
10. There are no boys allowed in the dorms (except on specific floors not associated with our camps). If you are caught with a boy in your room or floor, you will be sent home. Please tell a coach if you see a boy wandering around the halls.
11. No wandering around campus. Campers may not go anywhere on campus without a coach!
12. Be extremely careful when crossing all streets on campus. Look for both bicycles and cars.
13. Coaches will escort campers to and from the dorms to the dining and playing facility. Wait for your escort!
14. While in the gym keep water and sports drinks off the courts. Get your water bottle filled BEFORE leaving for the gym each session.
15. Campers may not play in the gym unless accompanied by a coach.
16. If campers get injured, a coach must immediately be notified as well as the athletic trainer.
17. No drugs, alcohol, or cigarettes (e-cigarettes included) allowed. If you are caught with any of these, you will be sent home.
18. If you are on medication, please make sure that our trainer has it and they know what it is for.
19. If your parents would like to watch they may, but they must not approach the coach and stay off the court.
